- 3. The Sexual Predator Treatment Program




State Security Program

The State Security Program (SSP)

Referral sources are limited to courts of criminal jurisdiction.

SSP serves the entire State of Kansas (105 counties)

Coordinating Admissions to the State Security Program

- Admissions for all District Court referrals are coordinated through KDADS legal division.
- District Courts provide a copy of the Journal Entry to KDADS Legal.
- When defendants are ordered to SSP, the order is reviewed to determine if the defendant must be admitted to SSP or if the individual could be considered for Mobile Competency.
- If the defendant is ordered to come to SSP and a bed is not available, they are placed on a wait list in the order of date referred.

Obstacles or Bottlenecks in the Process

- Available bed capacity at Larned.
- COVID-19 concerns and staffing shortages.
- Transportation for moving defendants quickly when a bed is available.
- Transition from an evaluation order to a treatment order if found incompetent.
- Defendants found incompetent and awaiting an order to commence involuntary civil commitment.
- Defendant who is competent awaiting next trial date stops taking medication.
- Limitations of Court Orders:
 - Court Orders that specifically required admission to SSP.
 - Time to obtain updated Court Orders.
 - Inability to consider PSP or OSH for Misdemeanor cases when Court Orders are too specific.

Complete forensic evaluations in secured confinement settings and in the communities where the individual is located.
