
The Thirtieth Judicial District Judicial Nominating Commission **will meet at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, January 25, 2019, in the District Courtroom of the Harper County Courthouse, Anthony, Kansas**, to interview and select a district magistrate judge who will be a resident of Harper County.

The Commission welcomes recommendations of persons and self-nominations to fill the position being vacated by District Magistrate Judge James Richard Biles, effective January 15, 2019. Each applicant who wishes to be considered for the position must complete a nomination form, available from the Clerk of the District Court in Barber County (Medicine Lodge), Harper County (Anthony), Kingman County (Kingman), Pratt County (Pratt), or Sumner County (Wellington). In addition, application forms are available from the Clerk of the Appellate Courts (Topeka); and at <http://www.kscourts.org>. Online applications will not be accepted. The form and its accompanying release must be signed by the applicant, and an original and 11 copies, together with the same number of any supporting letters or other relevant documents, must arrive in the:

no later than 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 3, 2019. Any other information or credentials that may be relevant to the applicant's qualifications also must be submitted by that time.

A district magistrate judge is required to be a graduate of a high school or secondary school or the equivalent; to be a resident of the relevant county at the time of taking the oath of office and to maintain residency in the relevant county while holding such office; and to either be a lawyer admitted to practice law in Kansas or pass an examination given by the Supreme Court and become certified within 18 months, as provided by K.S.A. 20-334(b) and K.S.A. 20-337.
