

IN THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF KANSAS

Administrative Order No. 35

Governor John Carlin has requested that the Judicial Branch of Kansas Government voluntarily comply with his request to reduce State General Fund expenditures for fiscal year 1983 by 4% of the amount of fiscal year 1983 State General Fund monies heretofore authorized by the Legislature and approved by the Governor for the Judicial Branch for fiscal year 1983.

After consideration of the various communications between officials and staff representatives of the Judicial Branch and officers of the Executive and Legislative Branches about current and estimated State revenue collections as they pertain to the serious fiscal problems currently facing the government of the State of Kansas relative to State General Fund appropriations, it is the decision of the Supreme Court that, to the extent deemed possible and to the extent the vital operations of the Judicial Branch are not jeopardized, it will voluntarily comply with the Governor's request to spend 4% less than the amount of fiscal year 1983 State General Fund monies appropriated to the Judicial Branch.

It is the decision of the Court that every effort shall be made to attain a personnel cost savings of up to \$1,290,000.00 during fiscal year 1983 from the duly authorized State General Fund monies appropriated to the Judicial Branch for fiscal year 1983.

Pursuant to the Supreme Court's general administrative authority over the Kansas Judicial Branch of government, until further order of

recommendation of the Judicial Administrator, that there is an absolute necessity that the particular position be filled.
