The Twenty-First Judicial District Nominating Commission will convene at 9:00 a.m., on August 14, 2017, at the Riley County Courthouse, Manhattan, Kansas, to interview and appoint a district magistrate judge residing in Riley County.


Statutes require a district magistrate judge to be a graduate of a high school or secondary school or the equivalent; to be a resident of Riley County at the time of taking the oath of office and maintain residency in Riley County while holding such office; and to either be a lawyer admitted to practice law in Kansas or to pass an examination given by the Supreme Court and to become certified within 18 months, as provided by K.S.A. 20-334; 20-337; and 20-338.

The Commission will welcome recommendations of nominees to fill the position. Recommendations must be accompanied by a nomination form which is available from the Clerk of the Riley County District Court (Manhattan); Clerk of the Clay County District Court (Clay Center); Clerk of the Appellate Courts; and at www.kscourts.org under "What's New". The nomination form must be completed and signed by the nominee.
