NOTICE AND CONSENT TO LIMITED REPRESENTATION NOTICE

To help you with your legal problems, a lawyer may agree to give you some of the help you want, but not all of it. In other words, you and the lawyer may agree that the lawyer will limit his representation to helping you with a certain legal problem for a short time or for a particular purpose. Limited representation is available only in civil cases.

When a lawyer agrees to help you for a short time or for a particular purpose, the lawyer must act in your best interest and give you competent help. When a lawyer and you agree that the lawyer will provide such limited help,

- --- The lawyer DOES NOT HAVE TO GIVE MORE HELP than the lawyer and you agreed.
- --- The lawyer DOES NOT HAVE TO help with any other part of your legal problem.

If short-term limited representation is not reasonable, a lawyer may give advice, but will also tell you of the need to get another lawyer.

specified above are the ONLY legal help this lawyer will give me. I understand and agree that the lawyer who is helping me with these services is not my lawyer for any other purpose and does not have to give me any more legal help. If the lawyer is giving me advice, or is helping me with legal or other documents, I understand the lawyer may decide to stop helping me whenever the lawyer wants. I also understand that if the lawyer goes to court for me, he or she does not have to help me after he goes to court unless we both agree in writing. I agree that the address I give below is my permanent address where I may be reached. I understand that it is important that both the opposing party and the court handling my case be able to reach me at this address in the event my attorney ends his limited representation. I therefore agree that I will inform the Court and the opposing party of any change in my permanent address.
