


Kansas eCourt: CCMS Project Update (11-15-21)



Changes to rollout schedule for 3rd and 18th judicial districts

The timeline for the 3rd Judicial District and the 18th Judicial District to move to the Kansas eCourt centralized case management system will change. Both districts are being pulled from their respective tracks and new dates will be announced when they are finalized.

Planning for multiple integrations

Courts in the 3rd and 18th judicial districts require multiple integrations with systems used by other entitles in the justice system. These integrations must be properly aligned when the courts begin their transition to the centralized case management system.

Plans to ensure all systems are properly aligned at go live are being developed. When the plans are final, new dates will be announced for these two districts to make their transition to the centralized case management system.

3rd Judicial District

The 3rd Judicial District is composed of Shawnee County. It has been pulled from Track 4, which includes five other districts scheduled to move to the centralized case management system early next year.

18th Judicial District

The 18th Judicial District is composed of Sedgwick County. It has been pulled from Track 6, which includes seven other districts scheduled to move to the centralized case management system next fall.

Courts currently operating on new system

Nine judicial districts currently operate on the new centralized case management system:

- 4th Judicial District: Anderson, Coffey, Franklin, and Osage counties
- 6th Judicial District: Bourbon, Linn, and Miami counties
- 8th Judicial District: Dickinson, Geary, Marion, and Morris counties
- 11th Judicial District: Cherokee, Crawford, and Labette counties
- 13th Judicial District: Butler, Elk, and Greenwood counties
- 14th Judicial District: Chautauqua and Montgomery counties
- 19th Judicial District: Cowley County
- 21st Judicial District: Clay and Riley counties
- 31st Judicial District: Allen, Neosho, Wilson, and Woodson counties

Future tracks

Future tracks will go live as shown on the <u>centralized case management system</u> <u>statewide rollout plan</u>.

Supreme Court Rules 20-24

Unless otherwise indicated, these rules apply to courts as they are brought onto the new case management system. They require the filer to correctly designate the case and document type. They also require the filer to indicate if the document complies with Rule 24 protecting personally identifiable information or if it is filed under seal.

These rules are necessary to protect individuals' personally identifiable information as district court records are made accessible through a public access portal as part of the new centralized case management system.
