


Kansas eCourt: CCMS Project Update (7-12-23)



Track 9 go-live date is August 7

The 18th Judicial District will transition to the new Kansas eCourt centralized case management system between August 2 and 7, affecting some processes as early as July 31. The 18th Judicial District is a one-county district composed of the Sedgwick County District Court. It is known as Track 9 in the Kansas eCourt statewide rollout plan.

TOGA wallet accounts

To pay filing fees to courts operating on the Kansas eCourt case management system, you must set up a TOGA wallet account under your user profile in the <u>Kansas Courts</u> <u>eFiling system</u>.

You must set up your account before you can begin to pay filing fees through the efiling system when you file in courts operating on the Kansas eCourt case management system.

The Sedgwick County District Court will require a TOGA wallet account for efiling payments beginning August 7.

Track 9 go-live impact on courts in Tracks 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, and 10

There will be minimal impact to courts in Tracks 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, and 10 when data from the Sedgwick County District Court is added to the Kansas eCourt case management system.

From **5 p.m. Friday, August 4,** to **12:01 a.m. Monday, August 7**, the Kansas eCourt case management system will be offline for courts in Tracks 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, and 10. The courts will not accept electronic filings or electronic payments.

The <u>Kansas District Court Public Access Portal</u> will not be able to retrieve case data from these courts during this time.

Courts affected are:

- 6th Judicial District: Bourbon, Linn, and Miami counties
- 7th Judicial District: Douglas County
- 8th Judicial District: Dickinson, Geary, Marion, and Morris counties
- 9th Judicial District: McPherson and Harvey counties
- 11th Judicial District: Cherokee, Crawford, and Labette counties
- 12th Judicial District: Cloud, Jewell, Lincoln, Mitchell, Republic, and Washington counties
- 13th Judicial District: Butler, Elk, and Greenwood counties
- 14th Judicial District: Chautauqua and Montgomery counties
- 15th Judicial District: Cheyenne, Logan, Rawlins, Sheridan, Sherman, Thomas, and Wallace counties
- 16th Judicial District: Clark, Comanche, Ford, Gray, Kiowa, and Meade counties
- 17th Judicial District: Decatur, Graham, Norton, Osborne, Phillips, and Smith counties
- 19th Judicial District: Cowley County
- 20th Judicial District: Barton, Ellsworth, Rice, Russell, and Stafford counties
- 21st Judicial District: Clay and Riley counties
- 22nd Judicial District: Brown, Doniphan, Marshall, and Nemaha counties

Track 9 go-live schedule

To prepare the Sedgwick County District Court to convert from FullCourt to the Kansas eCourt case management system, the court must stop taking filings and payments made electronically.

Supreme Court Administrative Order 2023-CC-056 establishes the conversion schedule for Sedgwick County District Court, which begins at **noon Monday, July 31**, and ends at **12:01 a.m. Monday, August 7.**

The conversion schedule is:

Monday, July 31

At noon, Sedgwick County District Court will stop taking electronic filings. The court will also stop accepting electronic payments and begin accepting only payments made in cash or by paper check.

Tuesday, August 1, through Thursday, August 3

The Sedgwick County District Court will be open and operating during regular business hours and accepting paper filings. Payments must be made in cash or by paper check.

Friday, August 4

The Sedgwick County District Court will be closed to the public. Electronic filing and electronic payments will still be turned off.

Monday, August 7

At 8 a.m., Sedgwick County District Court is fully operating on the eCourt case management system and electronic filing and electronic payments resume.

Supreme Court Rules 20–25

Unless otherwise indicated, these rules apply to courts as they are brought onto the Kansas eCourt case management system. They require the filer to correctly designate the case and document type. They also require the filer to indicate if the document complies with Rule 24 protecting personally identifiable information or if it is filed under seal.

These rules are necessary to protect individuals' personally identifiable information as district court records are made accessible through the public access portal as part of the Kansas eCourt case management system.

Supreme Court Rules 20–25 are known as the <u>Kansas eCourt rules</u> and they can be found on the <u>Search Rules page</u>.

Future tracks

Only two other tracks remain in the project. One covers appellate courts (Track 7) and the other the 10th Judicial District (Track 8). Appellate courts will transition in 2023 on a date yet to be announced. The 10th Judicial District is not yet scheduled.

The <u>Statewide Rollout Plan</u> is updated as new information becomes available.
